

ADMISSION PROCESS

The admission process to apply for ESDi can be done throughout the year. However, we strongly encourage that the application is submitted 12 to 6 months in advance to the beginning of the academic year in September. Please keep in mind that there is a limited number of vacancies for each itinerary, which will be assigned in strict order of reservation. For that reason, groups could be closed months before the start of the academic year. Once the reservation is formalised, the next step will be to enroll formally as a student during the established timeline (ordinary call in July or extraordinary call in September).

1. Admission process

1. Request for more information through our website by filling out the [following form](#), sending an email to admissions@esdi.edu.es or calling the following number +34 937 274 819. The admissions department will contact you to set an interview, either in person (which includes a tour through our facilities), or through video call.
2. Applicants will have to [submit the admissions test](#) (online and with no additional costs). Depending on the score of the test, a meeting with an academic tutor will be held if needed.
3. Those accepted will receive an admission letter to the requested program.
4. Payment of the reservation fee.
5. Begin the enrollment process.

2. Academic requirements depending on your education system

- a) Spanish education system:
 - Baccalaureate + Spanish university entrance examinations (PAU).
 - Higher vocational training certificate (CFGS) (possible validation).
 - Entrance examinations for students over 25, 40 or 45 years old.
 - Students coming from other university degrees (possible consideration of credit recognition).
- b) European Union member states, Switzerland, International Baccalaureate (IB) and China:
 - If you are accessing a Spanish university for the first time, you must request accreditation from the Spanish National Distance Learning University (UNED) <http://www.uned.es/accesoUE>.
- c) Students coming from other education systems. A European citizenship or residence in Spain is required, but candidates must come from non-European education systems that do not have current agreements with Spain:
 - A homologation of your completed studies must be requested through the Spanish Education Ministry (all official academic documentation must be in Spanish). For any other language, a sworn translation into Spanish including an official seal from your home country must be provided. The documentation must be apostilled (Hague Convention countries) or legalized (non-Hague Convention countries).

3. Economic policy

The enrollment will be considered formalized once the reservation is completed and the first payment is done. The payment means that the student accepts the tuition and it will be taken as a signature of the enrollment in the corresponding course. Check the economic conditions of the reservation, the cancelation or postponement of the course, enrollment changes, enrollment cancelation or student withdrawal, as well as the details of your degree.
